

What do these programs cost? Just \$10 for the year. A T-shirt is included with registration.

Can the parents attend the program? Yes, parents are welcome to join in, either to be a helper or just to observe. However, we ask observing parents to be respectful towards the adults who are working with the children. Also, regularly attending parents will be subject to a background check.

Can my child be suspended for bad behavior? Yes. Suspension is a last resort. Children are expected to show respect and compliance to classroom rules. Children who are excessively unruly or poorly behaved could be suspended for a period of time.

Weather Cancellations, how will we know? In the case of a cancellation due to weather or any other situation, a mass text will be sent to all the parents. Also be sure to check the church website or Facebook page.

What is the policy concerning communicable diseases? Our policy mandates that any child with contagious illness will not be allowed to attend our program. This includes but not limited to lice, vomiting, diarrhea, flu, chicken pox, and any other illness that causes fever. If a child has a fever of 100 degrees or more or a child is feeling sick or not well, parents will be called to pick up their children. Children can return when they are not sick.

Do these programs run all year long? No. They run September through May. Consult our calendar or website for start and end dates.

What is Mpack Girls? (AKA Girls Ministries) Missionettes is a mentoring program for girls K-8th grade. Mpack Clubs offers girls the opportunity to realize their full potential in Christ. What to expect each week? Each week children participate in games, activities, crafts, bible lessons, devotionals, and meaningful friendships. Boys and girls earn badges and awards that they wear on vests and sashes.

Where are these programs located? Douglas Assembly of God. 501 S. 4th Street Douglas, WY. Children will be dropped off and picked up in the church's sanctuary.

What time does everything begin? Dinner is served at 5:15pm. Programs start at 6:15pm.

Dinner? Did you say dinner? Yes! we serve a full dinner from 5:15-6:00pm. Parents and families are welcome to join us. Dinner is first come first served.

What time does it all end? Programs end at 7:45pm. We ask that all parents be present to pick up their kids by then.

Is transportation provided? We provide transportation from the Boys and Girls Club. We only provide pick up from the club, but parents are responsible to pick up their children from the church. Children being transported from the club must have a signed waiver. The waiver is available at the club.

What do my children need to do to participate? Parents need to complete the registration form, along with the medical/liability waiver.

What should my children bring each week? Their uniform t-shirt and a positive attitude. Some groups may have a project that requires children to bring something else; group leaders will keep you informed.
